



A marriage made in heaven - Passion Fruit and Tarragon Sorbet scoops Great Taste Golden Fork from the North of England

The Great Taste awards celebrates the very best in food and drink. The Great Taste Golden Fork for the best food from the North of England has been presented to Beckleberry's for its Passion Fruit and Tarragon Sorbet. Made in Blaydon on Tyne, near Newcastle, this innovative and unusual flavour combination wowed Great Taste judges including Aggie Mackenzie, who described it as a "perfectly balanced match". The bright acidity of passion fruit and the aniseed hit of tarragon work together in perfect harmony to create a product that is "refreshing and not too sweet".

Out of 10,000 products entered into Great Taste 2015, the Passion Fruit and Tarragon Sorbet was celebrated as the best tasting product in its region at the Great Taste Golden Forks Dinner held on Monday 7 September at The Royal Garden Hotel in Kensington, where over 300 guests from the world of fine food gathered to hear the results of many months of rigorous judging.

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The Golden Fork from the North of England was sponsored by Cress Co and also nominated this year was a Great Taste 3-star Fiocco by Greedy Little Pig in West Yorkshire and a Great Taste 3-star Monument Soft Bitter by Tyne Bank Brewery from Tyne & Wear.

Beckleberry's also scooped the top award of Supreme Champion in 2008 for its Blackcurrant and Kirsch Sorbet.
